## Adam Helms



<u>Sister Gallery</u> in Los Angeles opened a new exhibition this week by New York-based artist Adam Helms. Titled "Rising Down," this exhibition is a continuation of the artist's interest in photojournalism, conflict, political propaganda and extremist ideology. Helms will present two arrangements of hoods rendered in ink on mylar in a grid format, along with two large assemblages of source material that features war-related images. These visuals, though obtained from varying time periods, relate closely to publicized brutality and conflict in modern society. The artist was featured in "Greater New York 2005" at <u>PS1</u> and was a part of the three-person exhibit "Ordinary Culture: Heikes/Helms/McMillian" this past fall with the <u>Walker Art Center</u> in Minneapolis. The artist is an award

recipient of <u>The Chinati Foundation</u>, <u>The Rema Hort Mann Foundation</u> Visual Art Grant Award and <u>The Louis Comfort Tiffany Foundation</u> Award. More can be read about the Helm's work in this month's <u>Artforum</u> (pages 210-211).
