

James Turrell Guggenheim Museum, New York June 21 - September 25th, 2013

Conceived for the guggenheim museum, New York, James Turrell's 'aten reign' (2013) recasts the rotunda of the frank lloyd wright-designed building into an enormous illuminated void of shifting artificial and natural luminescence.

In this, his first exhibition in new york since 1980, the artist continues his in depth exploration of the perception of light, color and space, re-imagining the central volume of the cultural institution as an immersive light-filled space, with strong references to his ongoing 'roden crater project' (1979-). Opening on the summer solstice, turrell dramatically transforms the museum, offering a dynamic perceptual experience through the modulation of color emitted through the round chamber.








