## Vienna Today: Activating Futures Vienna Contemporary Art Exhibition

The Hai Museum of Art proudly launches the 'Vienna Today: Activating Futures – Vienna Contemporary Art Exhibition' on April 22. Moving forward, the Hai Museum of Art will continue to embrace openness, exploring diverse exhibition formats to showcase global artistic practices and cultivate a more dynamic international art ecosystem.
